



HMB Regulation and Requirements Aventail

•Chainmail aventail. The most popular type of neck protection for Bascinet helmets. It is permitted to use such aventails with: -Nasal bascinet -Wolf-rib bascinet -other bascinets such as klapvisors, pig-faces, etc. -RoA (Romance of Alexander)

-Italian bascinet

Permitted:

- •Scale aventail. It is permitted to use such aventails with:
- -Klapvisor bascinets -RoA -Italian Bascinets
- •Fabric aventails. It is permitted to use such aventails with:
- -Wolf-rib bascinets -RoA -Italian bascinets Klapvisor bascinets
- •Gorgets as the main element of Neck protection.
- -Grandbascinet -Great Helm -Sugarloaf helmet



We RECOMMEND wearing a small triangle shield on the front side of chainmail aventail with a coat-of-arms.

Refused:

Combined aventails: -Chainmail and fabric -Chainmail and scaled -Fabric and scale

Requirements:

- It must be attached to the leather connections on the helmet
- •It must completely cover fabric pelerine
 - It must be attached to the edge of the pelerine by thread or leather





HMB Regulation and Requirements - Helmets - Aventail Fabric aventail

REFUSED







Requirements:

- •The same connection as chainmail aventails
 - Materials: Wool, Silk, Linen
- •It should have decorative elements including at least one of the following:
- Heraldic image Medieval ornament
 - be quilted -Festons

There should be hidden plates for neck protection or chainmail

Unquilted aventails should be attached to the edge to pelerine/chainmail










Plate armor element worn around the neck to protect the throat, back of the neck and clavicles.
